

How to Clean Dentures



Fill Sink with Water

Remove and clean your dentures daily over a sink filled with water to avoid breaking them if they should fall.



Rinse Dentures in Warm Water

Before brushing, rinse your dentures in warm water to remove any loose bits of food and/or debris.



Use a Denture Cleanser & Brush

Ideally use a denture brush and cleanser to clean your dentures. Avoid using a normal toothbrush, toothpaste or soap.



Clean All Surfaces

Moisten your denture brush and gently clean all surfaces of your dentures well. Be careful with clasps and avoid brushing too hard.



Rinse Denture Brush

Rinse the denture brush in clean, warm water and tap dry and store uncovered.



Rinse and Store Dentures in Cold Water Overnight

Rinse denture in clean, warm water, then store dentures in fresh cold water overnight.

Denture Care

- Remove and rinse dentures after eating.

 Use water to remove food debris and other loose particles.
- Clean your mouth after removing your dentures.

 Use a soft-bristled toothbrush with fluoridated toothpaste to clean your natural teeth and a gauze or a soft toothbrush to clean your tongue, cheeks and roof of your mouth.
- Clean your dentures daily.

 Remove and gently clean your dentures daily with a denture brush and cleanser (ideally).

- Soak dentures overnight.

 Place your dentures in water or a mild denture-soaking solution every night.
- Rinse dentures thoroughly before putting them back in your mouth, especially if you use a denture-soaking solution.
- Schedule regular dental check-up.

 Promptly inform a dentist if your dentures no longer fit or are causing pain and/or discomfort.

- X avoid using a normal toothbrush, toothpaste or soap to clean your dentures. Use a denture brush and cleanser to clean your dentures.
- X Do not use denture cleanser inside your mouth.
- Do not wear your dentures to sleep overnight!
 Wearing dentures to sleep will lead to denture stomatitis (inflammation of gum tissue).
